Why Lacuna Fund?

- A lack of unbiased, labeled datasets that address real-world problems is putting the benefits of ML out of reach for many.
- Often, labeled data required to build AI systems don't exist outside North America and Europe.
- The result: systematic inaccuracies or harmful outcomes for people of color, women, and other marginalized populations.

A lacuna is a gap, or a missing portion of a manuscript.

Mobilizing labeled datasets that solve urgent problems in lowand middle-income contexts globally.

The Fund

- Lacuna Fund is the world's first collaborative effort in this space
- We support the creation, expansion, and maintenance of datasets that allow ML tools to better tackle urgent problems.
- Though our focus is on datasets, we recognize that improving equitable outcomes requires more, including diversifying the data science talent pool, de-biasing existing data, and addressing power imbalances in the field

Datasets

Datasets will:

- Be open source (with very limited exceptions)
- Follow ethics and privacy best practices
- Be locally developed and owned
- Be of interest to ML communities broadly (address multiple problems)

The Fund uses an open solicitation process: Requests for Proposals in different domain areas

Lacuna Fund only funds dataset creation, expansion, or maintenance.

Process

The Steering Committee, with the support of the Secretariat and the input of data science communities, determines domain areas for funding.

Within each domain, the **Technical Advisory Pa**nel determines priority needs and authors the Purpose and Needs section of the RFP.

Applicants make a compelling case for a dataset and what applications it will enable.
