- This talk and lively interaction with grantees will pose some of the essential
  questions we can ask ourselves as we make tech that changes the world. The
  tech we make, the data we choose, the models we design are all interwoven in
  how rights are expressed (or repressed).
- Based on the "AI & Equality" Human Rights Toolbox platform, built originally in collaboration with the United Nations Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR), with a jupyter notebook filled with code and fairness metrics developed at EPFL (École Polytechnique Fédérale de Lausanne) in Switzerland.
